## **5 Situations 911 Will Attempt to Stay on the Line Until Responders Arrive**

## Dispatch Life Support "Pre-Arrivals" (PAIs) are needed.

Includes time/life critical situations such as Airway Management, CPR, Childbirth, Choking, Sinking Vehicle, Person on Fire, etc.

> Patients who are **Unconscious** Includes Generalized Seizures, Ovedoses, Fainting

## Patients who are experiencing **Priority Symptoms**

including Chest Pain, Respiratory Distress, Serious Bleeding, or where the patient is Not Alert

> **Serious Traumatic Injuries** Includes Unstable or Unsafe Scenes, Critical Falls, Amputations

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Any time the TC's judgment determines staying on the line is in the **best interests** of the patient or bystanders. Note: incoming 911 call volume may limit a TC's ability to remain on the line in many situations where the patient is not critical.
